The Placement Cell Report

Placement Cell Report 2024-25

The Placement Cell of Motilal Nehru College, under the convenorship of Prof. Ajad Singh, actively functioned during the academic year 2024–25. The Cell worked with the mission of facilitating employment and internship opportunities for the students and enhancing their industry exposure. The Placement Cell was supported by an enthusiastic team of student office bearers, including Shreyash as President, Sahaj as Vice-President, Umang as Head of Student Relations, Ayush as Head of Media, Samridhi as Head of Communication, Ashish as Head of Content, and Devang as Head of Corporate Relations, along with Deputy Head Shreya Dwivedi and other senior and junior coordinators.

Throughout the session, the Placement Cell undertook various initiatives to engage students and build corporate relations. One of the most significant events was the Mega Job Fair organized in collaboration with Samarthanam Trust for the Disabled on 12th November 2024. This event aimed to provide employment opportunities to youth from economically weaker sections and persons with disabilities.

Beyond major events, the Cell consistently circulated placement and internship opportunities across sectors like business development, finance, insurance, technology, and marketing. Over the course of the year, more than 43 placement opportunities were shared with the students, with notable recruiters including Planet Spark, WTW India, Radiant Techsolution, IHG IT Services India Pvt Ltd, The Intect, Crowe LLP, DE Shaw & Co, and many others.
