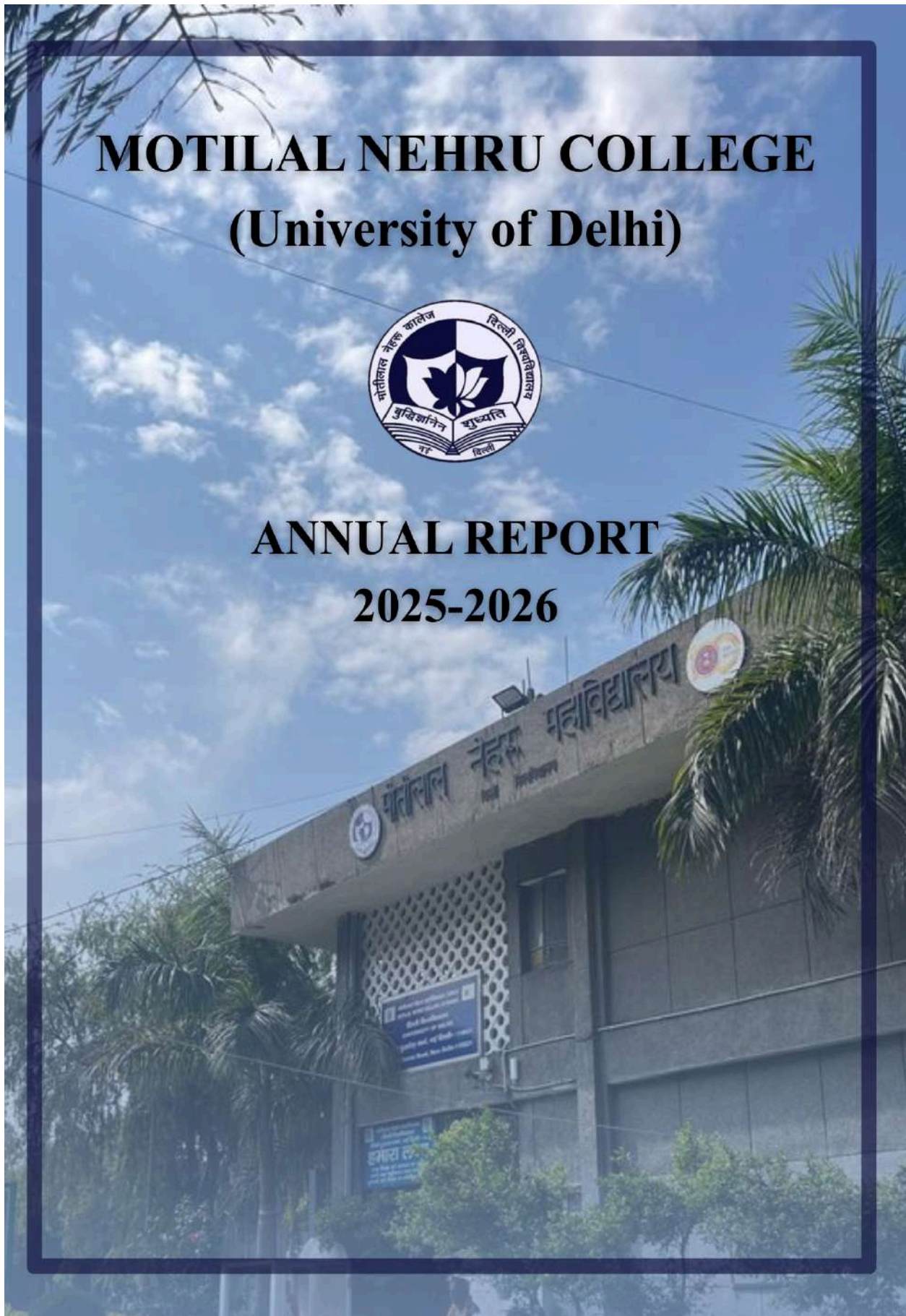

- Enactus MLNC undertook a wide range of initiatives integrating social impact, sustainability, and entrepreneurship throughout the academic year. Activities commenced in August 2025 with key milestones, including a collaboration with the University of Calgary for Project SNEH, the formal commencement of Project Biothene through an MoU with the Packaging Club, and the launch of Project TISSERA. These developments laid the foundation for subsequent project expansion and outreach.
- In September, Project TISSERA recorded its first sales transaction in collaboration with the Cloth Box Foundation, marking the beginning of its market engagement. October witnessed multiple developments, including continued sales transactions, the first sales drive under the collaboration tenure, and two successful sales drives for Project Biothene at Dilli Haat, INA, alongside its first school awareness session at the School of Excellence.
- November marked a phase of consolidation and growth, with Project Biothene conducting a second school awareness session at Government Girls Senior Secondary School, Karol Bagh, and the establishment of an international collaboration with Prince Edward Island Enactus. Additional milestones included further sales transactions, the second collaboration-based sales drive, and cumulative sales exceeding ₹21,500 across the project tenure.
- The organisation also prioritised knowledge-building and experiential learning through seminars and competitions. Members attended a seminar on canine behaviour, focusing on responsible interaction, behavioural cues, and safety awareness, supported by interactive discussions and practical insights. Participation in competitions such as the Business Plan competition at SGNDKC and a case competition at IIT Roorkee further enhanced analytical thinking, presentation skills, and competitive exposure.
- Community engagement was further strengthened through an awareness session on dog safety and empathy conducted in collaboration with Heads Up for Tails Foundation. The

session encouraged responsible behaviour towards animals and reflected the organisation's commitment to addressing broader social issues beyond its core projects.

- Project TISSERA continued to build its entrepreneurial footprint through quality-driven collaborations, including a partnership with iEnergizer for the delivery of premium tote bags. The initiative was well received for its quality, affordability, and professional execution, reinforcing the project's focus on customer satisfaction, sustainability, and reliable service delivery.
- Project Biothene demonstrated steady progress through multiple sales drives and awareness initiatives, successfully selling 40 kg of biodegradable bags, with a projected target of 65–70 kg. School awareness sessions educated students on sustainable alternatives to plastic, while planned webinars and additional outreach efforts aimed to further expand its environmental impact.
- February activities included an awareness session with Uttejna and the third sales drive of Project Biothene at Khan Market, contributing to continued growth in outreach and sales. Subsequent plans for March and April included additional sales drives and school awareness sessions, both offline and online, ensuring sustained engagement and scalability of the project.
- Project SNEH played a crucial role in combining social welfare with entrepreneurial initiatives. Two major sales drives significantly increased the distribution of sanitary pads and diapers in underserved communities, contributing to both financial sustainability and grassroots impact. Awareness efforts were further strengthened through creative initiatives such as nukkad naatak performances, which effectively communicated key messages and encouraged community participation.

A key highlight of Project SNEH was the awareness drive conducted in the slum areas of Moti Nagar, focusing on menstrual health, hygiene, and breaking societal taboos. The initiative encouraged open discussions among children and young girls, fostering awareness and confidence. Conducted in collaboration with a supporting NGO, the drive ensured smooth execution and wider outreach while also enabling members to develop communication, leadership, and teaching skills.

Entrepreneurship Cell:

Convenor Mr. Karamveer Dhurandhar

- **EGNITE 6.0 – Entrepreneurship Festival**

The Entrepreneurship Cell, Motilal Nehru College, organized Egnite 6.0, a three-day flagship entrepreneurship and innovation festival held on 16th, 17th, and 19th April 2025, with a footfall of over 5000 participants. The event aimed to nurture entrepreneurial thinking through hands-on exposure to startup ideation, pitching, teamwork, and leadership. It featured key segments such as Shark Tank 3.0, Brandwich (Case Study Competition), Entropoly 2.0, and Social-it 4.0, along with expert sessions that enhanced students' communication, problem-solving, and business planning skills.

- **NIRMAAN – Startup Buildathon 2025**

Organized by Nivesh under the Entrepreneurship Cell, NIRMAAN was a 30-hour startup buildathon held on 17th–18th November 2025, attracting a footfall of over 5000 participants. The event provided practical exposure to the startup ecosystem, guiding participants from ideation to final pitching through structured mentorship, market research, and business planning activities. The top three teams were awarded prizes worth ₹12,000+, along with an opportunity to pitch at Shark Tank 4.0, making the event a significant platform for fostering innovation and entrepreneurial skills.

- **IIT Roorkee E-Summit'26 Visit**

In collaboration with the Entrepreneurship Cell, IIT Roorkee, a delegation of 33 students participated in the E-Summit 2026 from 6th to 8th February, gaining national-level exposure to entrepreneurship and innovation. Students engaged in competitions, keynote sessions, and networking with peers from premier institutions such as IITs, IIMs, and BITS. A major highlight was the Entrepreneurship Cell, MLNC securing 1st position in the Entrepreneurship General Championship by winning multiple events including Ideastorm, Mind the Product, Market Sphere, and CaseQuest, reflecting exceptional strategic thinking and teamwork.

Faculty Induction Program:

- Organized by Motilal Nehru College on 17 Feb-18 Feb 2026, in collaboration with Ramanujan College under the Malviya Mission Teacher Training Program, the initiative aimed at enhancing pedagogical skills, research understanding, and professional competencies of newly appointed faculty through expert lectures, workshops, and interactive sessions.

- The program witnessed participation from faculty across multiple institutions, fostering academic exchange and discussions on contemporary teaching methods, research ethics, leadership, and technology integration in education.
- Conducted under the guidance of Prof. Ekta Duggal, with Dr. Vinamrata Akash as Co-Coordinator and a dedicated organizing team, the program was successfully executed with institutional support and significantly contributed to professional development and academic excellence.

Film Screening Committee:

- During the academic session 2025–26, the Film Screening Committee and associated societies at Motilal Nehru College organized a range of cinematic and creative programmes focusing on social issues, academic discourse, and skill-building through film. The year began with a notable intellectual event centred on the novel *Mau Junction*, jointly organized with Rachnayan B.A. Programme, bringing together literature, history, and cinema for interdisciplinary discussion.
- The event highlighted the growing intersection between literature and cinema, featuring insights from filmmakers Dharendra Dimri and Mayank Srivastava, who shared perspectives on adaptation, storytelling, and the evolving dynamics between written and visual narratives, thereby enriching students’ understanding of contemporary media practices.
- The committee also curated film screenings as a medium for academic and social engagement, including the screening of *Haq* and a short film on 20th January 2026 in collaboration with the Women’s Development Cell and Screen Sense Society. The session explored themes such as gender justice, the Shah Bano case, and Triple Talaq, followed by interactive discussions encouraging critical reflection among students.
- Further strengthening its engagement with contemporary issues, the committee planned a panel discussion on “Gender Issues in Cinema and Media,” featuring prominent speakers including Prof. Smita Mishra, Deepak Dua, Garima Rani, and Pooja Mohan Pandey. The initiative aimed to foster dialogue on representation, media ethics, and gender perspectives, reinforcing the committee’s role in promoting socially relevant and intellectually engaging cinematic discourse.

Garden Committee:

- The Garden Committee undertook several initiatives to enhance the aesthetic appeal of the college campus. The lawn opposite the library was developed into a lush green space, while the passageway between the Science Block and Generator Block was adorned with decorative flower baskets. Additionally, plants were installed in the SV Block to further strengthen the greenery across the परिसर.
- On 26th February, the committee organized its first-ever Flower Show in the college lawns, showcasing 15–20 varieties of seasonal flowers cultivated by the gardening staff, including Mr. Vijay, Mr. Vinod, Mr. Parvesh, and Mr. Uma Shankar. - **ICC Seminar on Prevention of Sexual Harassment (27 January 2026)** — The Internal Complaints Committee organized a seminar for non-teaching staff on the Prevention of Sexual Harassment at the Workplace, delivered by Dr. Shivani Verma (Senior Assistant Professor, Delhi University Law Centre), focusing on the legal framework under the POSH Act, preventive measures, and redressal mechanisms, in the presence of the Principal, Prof. Yogeshwar Sharma, IQAC Convenor Prof. A. M. Khan, ICC Convenor Prof. Pragati Mehra, and committee members; the session included an interactive Q&A segment and was well received by participants, resulting in enhanced awareness, improved understanding of legal provisions and ICC procedures, and a reinforced commitment to a safe, respectful, and gender-sensitive workplace.
- **Seminar on “Empowering Women Through Education: Zero Tolerance to Sexual Harassment” (3 April 2025)** — The event was organized in the Staff Room with the objective of promoting gender sensitivity, legal awareness, and a zero-tolerance approach towards sexual harassment, featuring an insightful session by Leena Sharma attended by over 75 participants; the speaker effectively explained key concepts including definitions, legal rights, redressal mechanisms, and the role of the Internal Complaints Committee, while engaging the audience through interactive discussions and a Q&A session, resulting in enhanced awareness among teaching staff, positive feedback on the session’s

relevance, and a strengthened institutional commitment to maintaining a safe, respectful, and inclusive environment.

- **ICC–WDC Webinar on Gender Sensitisation (27 August 2025)** — The Women’s Development Cell and Internal Complaints Committee jointly organized an online webinar to promote awareness of gender sensitisation, legal frameworks, and safety measures, featuring sessions by Advocate Shivani Verma, who explained the POSH and POCSO Acts with case-based insights and redressal mechanisms, and Mr. Atul Pratap Singh (Sub-Inspector, UP Police), who addressed issues of cybercrime, stalking, scams, and legal response strategies, equipping participants with practical knowledge, preventive measures, and a stronger understanding of personal and institutional safety.

- The Students' Union functioned effectively under the guidance of Principal Prof. Yogeshwar Sharma and Convenor Shaurabh Dubey, with office bearers working in coordination to ensure smooth execution of activities and events throughout the year.
- **Students' Union Elections 2025** — The elections were conducted in a transparent and democratic manner, with strict implementation of Lyngdoh Committee recommendations. A key reform was the enforcement of a 75% attendance criterion, ensuring responsible and academically committed student leadership, with active and peaceful participation.
- **Freshers' Welcome & Oath-Taking Ceremony** — The Annual Freshers' Party welcomed the new batch through cultural performances and talent showcases, fostering a sense of belonging. The oath-taking ceremony of elected representatives was also conducted, marking the beginning of their tenure and commitment to student service.
- **Annual College Fest – Phoenix 2026** — The flagship cultural fest was organized on a grand scale, featuring performances by DU societies and a major live performance by artist Alfaaz. The event witnessed large participation and successful inter-college engagement, reflecting effective coordination between the Union and administration.

Women Development Cell:

Convenor Ms. Priya Singh

- The Women's Development Cell (WDC) of Motilal Nehru College, in collaboration with Screen Sens, organised a **film screening session** on 20th January 2026 at 11:00 am to encourage critical reflection on gender roles, women's labour, and everyday patriarchy. The event featured the documentary *Haq* and the short film *Juice*, both of which addressed themes of structural inequality, rights, and the invisibility of women's unpaid domestic labour. The screening was followed by an interactive discussion in which students shared reflections and critically engaged with the themes presented. The session successfully utilised cinema as a tool for awareness and dialogue, reinforcing the Cell's commitment to promoting gender sensitivity and critical engagement with issues affecting women and gender minorities.
- On 18 November 2025, WDC organised a **visit to Samadhan NGO** to celebrate Children's Day with the children supported by the institution, with the aim of creating an interactive and joyful experience while familiarising volunteers with the organisation's work. The visit began with an introduction by the NGO staff, followed by a tour of facilities including the Occupational Therapy room, Speech Therapy room, and Special Education section, offering insights into interventions for children with intellectual disabilities.
- WDC organized a **Teachers' Day Celebration** on 6 September to honour and express gratitude towards the faculty members for their invaluable contribution to academic and personal development. Faculty members shared insightful addresses, offering guidance and motivation, which added depth to the occasion. A special music jam session by Malhaar, the Music Society, further enhanced the celebratory atmosphere and encouraged active participation.
- WDC organized a **workshop on Mental Health and Emotional Well-being** on 15 October in the Seminar Room in collaboration with TEENBOOK Consortium, with the objective of fostering awareness, encouraging dialogue, and equipping students with practical tools to navigate emotional challenges. The session addressed key mental health concerns among young adults, including stress, anxiety, academic pressure, burnout, social isolation, body image issues, cyberbullying, and the impact of social media, while also highlighting early signs of depression such as withdrawal, behavioral changes, and loss of interest. Resource persons emphasized healthy coping mechanisms like mindfulness, journaling, emotional regulation, and seeking support, along with the importance of professional help when needed.
- WDC launched the **podcast series "PAHAL"** in January 2026 as a platform to foster

meaningful dialogue on pressing social issues. The initiative resulted in five episodes, each managed by dedicated teams handling research, production, and execution. The series featured discussions on gender and caste with journalist Meena Kotwal, mental health with psychologist Gagandeep Kaur, social work with Prof. Sukriti Chowdhary, legal awareness with Advocates Deeksha and Sita Mishra, and cancer awareness with Dr. Anushree Vartak. The series successfully promoted awareness, diverse perspectives, and informed engagement.

- WDC organized a **Sanitary Pad Distribution Drive** on 7 December 2025 in Janakpuri in collaboration with Warriors Without Cause, aiming to address menstrual health awareness and accessibility. Supported by the partner NGO, the initiative was effectively executed and served as a meaningful step toward promoting menstrual dignity and inclusivity.
- WDC organized a **Breast Cancer Awareness** webinar on 14th October 2025, conducted by Dr. Anushree Vartak, Senior Consultant at Yashoda Multispeciality Hospital, with around 45 participants in attendance. The session provided a comprehensive overview of cancer, its causes, and risk factors, including genetic, lifestyle, and environmental influences, while also explaining the difference between benign and malignant tumors. Emphasis was placed on breast cancer awareness, highlighting that one in twenty-nine women in India is at risk, and discussing modifiable and non-modifiable risk factors. The webinar also covered early detection methods such as self-examination and mammography, the importance of a healthy lifestyle, and the need to address myths and misinformation surrounding cancer.
- The Women's Development Cell (WDC) and the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) of Motilal Nehru College organized an online webinar on 27th August 2025 to promote awareness on **gender sensitisation, legal frameworks, and preventive measures against harassment and crime**. The session featured Advocate Shivani Verma, who discussed gender equality laws including the POSH and POCSO Acts with case-based insights, and Mr. Atul Pratap Singh, Sub-Inspector, Uttar Pradesh Police, who addressed issues related to cybercrime, stalking, scams, and legal response mechanisms. The webinar highlighted the importance of identifying and reporting harassment, understanding legal protections, and adopting preventive strategies for personal and digital safety.
- **Flagship Event: REHNUMA 2026** — Held on 28 March 2026, Rehnuma 2026, the annual flagship event of the Women's Development Cell, provided a platform for meaningful dialogue on women's history and mental health, witnessing active participation from students and faculty. The programme featured sessions by Ms. Anoushka Jain and Ms. Meghna Anil, focusing on representation of women in history

and the importance of mental health awareness, self-reflection, and support systems, thereby fostering critical thinking and inclusive engagement within the campus community.

- हिंदी पखवाड़ा (22–30 सितंबर 2025) — हिंदी दिवस के उपलक्ष्य में आयोजित नौ दिवसीय कार्यक्रमों में उद्घाटन सत्र, “कार्यालयी हिंदी” कार्यशाला, कवि सम्मेलन (श्री गजेन्द्र सोलंकी, सुश्री कीर्ति काले, प्रो. दयाल सिंह पंवार), स्वरचित लेखन, पत्र लेखन, प्रशासनिक शब्दावली, काव्य पाठ एवं आशु भाषण, प्रश्नोत्तरी प्रतियोगिता, तथा समापन समारोह में टंकण कार्यशाला एवं पुरस्कार वितरण जैसे विविध आयोजन शामिल रहे, जिन्होंने विद्यार्थियों एवं कर्मचारियों की सक्रिय भागीदारी सुनिश्चित की।
