The College has an active Placement Cell which looks into the placements for it's students. In 2019-20, a total of 38 companies visited our campus and 109 number of students successfully got placed during the same session. The highest package offered in the year 2019-20 was 9 LPA and the average package offered was 4.3 LPA.

The Library has an up-to-date on line catalogue (OPAC) of its holding for all users.

UGC is facilitating the availability of E-books in the colleges through the "NATIONAL LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SERVICES INFRASTRUCTURE FOR SCHOLARLY CONTENT (N-LIST)" Program funded by MHRD, Government of India. The Program facilitates access about 97000 + e-books and 6000+ e-journals to those who access that program in the college library.
