

1. Women Development Cell

The Women Development Cell of Motilal Nehru College acts as a mechanism of change that helped build safe space within campus for women. It's a platform where ideas are exchanged, discussed, opinions are formed and vocalized. It helps in building an inclusive space for all, irrespective of the gender you identify with.



The Women's Development Cell (WDC), Motilal Nehru College conducted a variety of events during the academic year 2021-2022. WDC provides a platform for open discussions on gender related issues to sensitize both the genders. The list of events executed are-

- 1. The women's Development Cell of Motilal Nehru College, organized an ICC Awareness March, to enlighten and address the consequences and punishments of sexual harassment. The march was followed by a webinar on the same which was addressed by Punita Maheshwari, Consultant, Gender and Sexuality at Jhatkaa.org and Ishani, Campaigns Manager, Gender and Secuality, Jhatkaa.org. They discussed Campus Safety and the steps that the students can take if someone harrasses them, they also spread awareness about the Internal Complaints Committee and how it works.

The speakers Dr. Chumki Bose, the Counselling Psychologist at Mindtribe and Dr. Anuna Bordoloi, the Consultant Clinical Psychologist in the Department of Mental Health and Behavioral Science at Fortis Healthcare shared a lot of helpful advice.



- Various monthly webinars would be conducted on various selected themes with the aim of spreading awareness among students.

- 6. 
2. Placement Cell

The Placement Cell is one of the most active entities of the college which attends to the placements of its students. One of the main objectives of the Cell is to foster corporate-ready individuals by encouraging its students to engage with the corporate world as much as possible. The purview of the Cell not only includes the provision of internships and placement opportunities, but also the overall development of students by organizing workshops, webinars/seminars, and articleships on topics ranging from soft skills to industrially relevant technical knowledge. The Placement Cell ventures to establish an enduring bond with its collaborators, helping students to attain the best of opportunities.



For the session of 2021-22, the placement process is still going on for a few companies. However, a total of 54 companies have visited our college till now for the placement of the batch of 2022. Around 700 students sat for placements in this session out of which 60+ students have been placed in renowned organizations. The highest package offered till now on-campus is 10 LPA and off- campus is 23 LPA. The average package offered for the session is 4.65 LPA. Some of the major recruiters for the session are EY GDS, WTW, TresVista, upGrad, Cvent, PwC, and more. The Placement Cell collaborated with Infosys, HP inc., Aon, Nexdigm, Codeyoung, Cultfit, Ditto insurance, Leverage Edu, InternIn, and Phronesis Partners for the very first time and we hope to make our corporate relations stronger with them for the upcoming sessions.

One of our major achievements for this session is CA Articleships. It was the first time that the Placement Cell has brought CA Articleship opportunities for the students of our college who are pursuing CA. We look forward to taking this collaboration ahead in upcoming years.




A total of 240 organizations have offered internship opportunities for our students and we are happy to share that many of them are selected for internships in Unacademy, Hindustan Times, Chegg India, WWF and more. The Placement Cell has always kept the interest of students as its priority and till now a total number of 29 programmes, workshops and webinars have been organized by the cell. Programmes of companies like Microsoft, Wipro, and KPMG were made available for the students of our college. Secondly, webinars from EY, Career



Launcher, Leverage Edu were also organized. Additionally, workshops on Data Analysis, MS-Excel and Personality and Resume Building were conducted to develop the skill-sets of the students.

Though the session was completely online and companies were not able to carry out offline placement drives, the Cell strived towards bridging the gap between opportunities and its students and achieved great success.



3. Alumni Committee

The speakers spoke on their varied experiences in the college, their academic and professional pursuits and their career trajectories. Both sessions received enthusiastic response from the alumni, faculty and students alike.

3. Film Screening Society- Kaleidoscope



The film screening society has had an eventful academic year which started with the screening of two films (documentary) namely 'Sikendra - A life in transit' and 'Women who beat drums' in the month of November, 2021. As a part of the screening we were grateful to have with us the director, Natasha Badhwar and the team of Karwan-e-Mohabbat who shared their experiences of making the films as well as the manner of intervention that determined the project.

In the month of December, we organised a Feminist film festival curated by Aanchal Kapur of Kriti. As a part of the festival, six films were screened. These included City Girls, Dreams on Wheels, The Grasshopper sleeps here, Love in the garden of consent, Our mountain valley home and Aika to the Baika. The best part of the festival apart from the films was that Aanchal Kapur brought on board film directors, producers and even actors who shared their experiences and, in the process, initiated a discussion on feminism.






9. STUDENT UNION ADVISORY COMMITTEE


11. Ambedkar Study Circle

12. National Seminar Committee








15. <u>NCWEB</u>

Infrastructure

Motilal Nehru College has a very modern technological enabled barrier free inclusive and environment friendly infrastructure. The College has every facility that is required in every modern higher education institution.

Library- The College has a rich collection of books, journals and periodicals at present count, the college has 1,07,586 volumes. The library subscribers to about 86 periodicals and magazines of scientific and general interest. The library also has more than 22206 books in the book bank/student aid fund section. The library has an up-to-date online catalogue (OPAC) of its holdings for all users, 21 computer stations with internet facility are also available for the library members. The library has two computer stations with specialized software for visually challenged students.

Computer Labs- The College maintains a fully air-conditioned Digital Resource Centre with 61 computer stations and is equipped with LAN as well as Wi-Fi internet connectivity with complete power backup. Each of the computers is loaded with all the software's required for the students' academic projects and activities. Every student of the College can freely access the facilities of the lab during college working hours. Besides the common access Digital Resource Centre, the College also has dedicated computer labs for departments of Computer Science, Mathematics, Commerce, Physics and Chemistry.



Conference Hall- The college boasts of a state-of-the-art conference room that can seat a hundred people. The room is equipped with the latest audio-visual and multimedia equipment. The College has hosted numerous national and international conferences and seminars in this room.

Medical Room- The College has a medical room adequately equipped to meet any medical emergencies in the College. A qualified and experienced medical doctor is available in the medical room from 11:00 A.M. to 01:00 P.M. on all working days. Students can avail of this facility free of charge.










LIBRARY REPORT


MLNC has 17 courses and a total of 1416 sanctioned seats. Course-wise bifurcation of sanctioned seats is given below-












